Face-groove, Circle, Burn-line Tool By Jeff Joseph



Having trird credit card, laminex, Formica, narrow

metal etc techniques. I



was not happy
with results
especially down
long grain. so I
tried the following
method to give an
extra wide surface
area on the
groove-burn.



Wire sits tight in holes $\bf C$ and $\bf D$ and is held by $\bf E$ and $\bf F$. NB: Hole in channel for $\bf C$ wire position. Hole $\bf C$ and $\bf H$ 3mm and $\bf D$ 2mm. $\bf N$ counter-sunk screw into handle at back and under channel. Tail of wire $\bf G$ fits into loose hole $\bf H$ to allow $\bf G$ to move in all directions without $\bf J$ touching back against front end of wood handle $\bf K$. NB: Visibility of wire from side view is important to gauge depth of burn.

Aftergrooving face with skew chisel, set burn tool on t rest \boldsymbol{L} just behind \boldsymbol{G} and $\boldsymbol{H}.$

Lathe speed at 1600 r.p.m. push burn tool into groove until burn is achieved noting that the 'loose' wire finds the groove. Rub a little 'EEE' into the groove and re-wire to finish.
