PRESIDENT'S REPORT: Looking back over the newsletters it's great to see how much we achieved and with such enthusiasm and support. The flyers we hand out indicate we meet twice a month, while officially that is true there is certainly a lot of additional time put in working on projects and of course giving woodwork lessons to grade 5 & 6 from Nambrok / Denison primary school, preparing materials, handing over refurbished and newly built items to the owners, yard work, and unloading materials for projects.

It is also what goes on behind the scenes away from the club that keeps us running smoothly - the bill paying, quote gathering, material preparation and the manufacture of items to take to displays we attend especially the hundreds of tops we hand out each year.

We were kept busy attending events such as the agriculture shows, Heyfield Vintage Engine Display, Shakespeare Festival and even as far afield as Buchan for the Mountain Cattleman's event we attend in the state each year. We did several visits to Bunnings Traralgon store for family evenings, kids woodworking sessions, community get-togethers and assembling a barbeque and trampoline. For which we were well rewarded.

We are fortunate to have a number of great sponsors who have helped the club continue to grow with generous discounts or donations of materials including bolts, timber, crushed rock and even concrete. A grant from Wellington Shire enabled us to upgrade the car park ensuring safe dry access to the building. And they helped fund the air conditioner to keep us comfortable inside.

A record number of chairs and tables were restored in the last 12 months including one in the workshop at present which shows the high quality of the work that has been turned out. We made up trestles and benches, modified trophies, provided the gavel for Latrobe City outgoing mayor, built storage units for our tools and the school kids' projects (once again with support from Bunnings). Ash Sawmill has been supplied with hundreds of levels and rulers with another batch of each delivered this month.

We have had a number of timber and tool auctions and I must thank everyone for the spirited bidding that certainly put a smile on Treasurer Norm's face

We have had some excellent guest speakers, Vic Forest, Traralgon Fire Brigade set up their snorkel unit in our drive, Screw it Screws, dovetail jig demonstration, carving display and Brian Grist gave an excellent talk on home security. We were also taken through the proper use of our Defibrillator unit. If you have a particular topic you would like covered please make it known.

We had excellent numbers sign up for our bus trips and this year we ran an additional one to the Paynesville Men's shed where we were made most welcome, perhaps we should try to plan more trips to visit other clubs or items of interest. We had a mini lathe donated to us by Neil Bradbury and we purchased one ourselves to go in the display trailer, we replaced the last of the blue lathes that had served us well and more cordless tools joined our collection to help projects flow smoothly.

My task as President has been made easy thanks to the endless support from everyone at the club. The fact I can be asked to assemble a trampoline on short notice and have a team lined up at Bunnings the next morning shows the enthusiasm of the members.

A special thanks to Treasurer Norm and our secretary lan who have done a fantastic job not just in the allocated task but in all they do for the group and of course to every member for the support they have shown me and the group.

TREASURERS REPORT: Over the past 12 months we have made several substantial purchases, including a full-size lathe for \$1925, a **mini lathe** the for \$475, two orbital sanders and a cordless drill kit totalling \$822, and a four-jaw chuck for \$161.

An air conditioner for the workshop cost \$813 after a \$3550 Wellington Shire grant, and new meeting room blinds cost \$360.

Generated income included restoration of four tables and two chairs for \$790, construction of a coffee table, trestle tables and bench seats for \$1520, not forgetting 160 ASH spirit levels for \$1380.

Other revenue came from timber, tools and machinery sales and auctions, sales at demonstrations and numerous commissioned and repair jobs.

Income from raffles totalled \$1750, door entry \$1800, while \$2820 was received in membership fees.

So, as can be seen in my monthly newsletter reports, and with several new members joining us for the current financial year, I am sure we can look forward to another successful 12 months both financially and socially.

Thanks goes to Kurt at Phillipsons in Sale for carrying out the financial audit.

GETTING AND SPENDING

During July some members have been busy fulfilling commissioned jobs. A bowl turned by John Cruickshank brought in \$28, Robert Ahearne made up a nice frame for a leadlight window, and Graeme Ingleton did an excellent job turning half a dozen detailed spindles for a small chair.

Some jelutong carving timber sold for \$25, one of Chris Franks' scrollsaw pictures sold for \$20, and two WWW show travellers have secured their bus seat, paying a total \$70.

Subs payments for the month totalled \$385, entry \$186, catering \$23 and our monthly raffle brought in \$82.

We paid our CNC router driver Daryl Hooke \$750 to manufacture and engrave 100 ASH spirit levels, electricity for the quarter cost \$302.32, a fire extinguisher check \$70.40 and a permit for the polycarbonate sheet roof over the rear deck was \$330.

We purchased a Ryobi battery from Bunnings for \$69, and a sheet of blackwood veneer from Variform Morwell for a table restoration amounted to \$155.71.

We had \$18,508.89 in our Bendigo Bank account on July 31.



Our guests had other commitments so had to miss the great lunch cooked up by Cyril and Michael. The kitchen helpers did a great job and there was no excuse for going hungry with plates of cake and biscuits on each table thanks to Freda. Norm's wife Judy provided the coleslaw.



After lunch the workshop came to life with many projects on the go including commencing the items we were asked to make for Sale Primary School.

COMMITTEE MEETING

The committee members had a meeting to discuss solutions to our timber and trailer storage issues that have been raised a number of times. After looking at all options it was decided to install a sea container behind our current trailer shed that can be used to store excess timber. Items such as the "open day" signs and the demonstration trailer will be stored in the front section making storing and removing from storage easier.

This will free up the current trailer shed so it can be used for timber storage. This will result in less clutter in the machinery shed. It was also agreed to erect a car port type construction behind the machinery shed that can be used for sanding and painting tasks and for some machinery tasks which will also avoid overcrowding in the shed at times. It will also be an asset on Open Day. Prices will be gathered and details relayed back to members.
